## Big Thank You To Everyone

This summer we were able to share with four churches about what God is doing in Haiti. One of the highlights was being part of a VBS who raised money for a church in Haiti, which lost its building during Hurricane Matthew in 2016. The small congregation has not been able to rebuild. They have recently purchased land on which to rebuild their church. The children and friends from the Germantown Church were able to raise \$880. The hope is that the church can begin laying a foundation before the rainy season starts. The church is located on a mountain which makes transportation of materials tricky.

We are always amazed at how many people partner with our family in Haiti. We are so thankful for the prayerful and financial support given each month. This summer was a privilege to see some of our many supporters. Your prayers help us get through the hard days.
